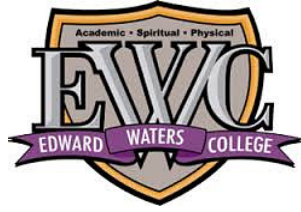


HBCU Juvenile Justice Reform Network
