Mr. Allen graduated from the University of Florida College of Law in 1962 and was the first African-American lawyer to be president of the Broward County Bar Association. He challenged legal discrimination in restaurants, hotels and housing. His landmark 1970 lawsuit led to desegregation of Broward County Schools.
